Packaging your English course with the University of Melbourne for visa purposes

A packaged offer allows you to apply for a single visa to cover both your English course at Hawthorn-Melbourne and your University of Melbourne program. Packaged offers are a great way to reduce the time and costs involved in applying for visas.

Are you eligible?

You **may** be able to apply for a packaged course if you have an offer from the University of Melbourne that is **only** conditional on meeting the English language requirements.

Some University of Melbourne courses have higher individual band score requirements.

This will affect the IELTS and TOEFL score required in order to package.

How to apply

Step 1: Apply to the University of Melbourne

- Make sure to include your IELTS, TOEFL, Pearson or CAE test result.
- The University of Melbourne will assess your application, and if successful issue you with a Letter of Offer.
- Check the conditions on your offer to make sure English is the **only** condition you need to meet.

Step 2: Apply to Hawthorn-Melbourne

- Send the following documents to Hawthorn-Melbourne Admissions: enquiries@hawthornenglish.vic.edu.au
 - Hawthorn-Melbourne Application Form
 - A copy of your Conditional Offer from the University
 - A copy of your IELTS/TOEFL result
- You will be sent a Letter of Offer for your English course.

Step 3: Confirm your enrolment with Hawthorn-Melbourne

- Sign the Student Acceptance Form and return to Hawthorn-Melbourne (enquiries@hawthornenglish.vic.edu.au) with your English course payment.
- Hawthorn-Melbourne will send you a "Confirmation of Enrolment" (e-COE).

Step 4: Confirm your enrolment with University of Melbourne

- Upload the following documents to the University's online application system
 - Acceptance Agreement Form University of Melbourne & Hawthorn Learning Package (provided with the University conditional offer letter)
 - Hawthorn-Melbourne eCoE
- The University of Melbourne will send you a conditional e-CoE for your course at the University of Melbourne[^]

Step 5: Apply for your visa

 Apply for your student visa using both the CoEs from the University of Melbourne and Hawthorn-Melbourne.

[`]The final decision on whether the University of Melbourne will issue a Conditional CoE for visa packaging remains with the University and may be influenced by considerations separate to English language.
